THANKS, MR. ROBINSON

In an act of special thanks for his service to skeet shooters through his columns in Sports Afield magazine, attendance at all the NSSA world championships and for his selection of skeet Ali-Americans, the Massachusetts Skeet Shooting Association awarded Jimmy Robinson with an appropriately engraved plaque. Robinson will be in Dallas in February to select members for his 32nd All-America squad.

FOUR SHOOT MARATHON

New Jersey has inauguarated an unusual marathon event consisting of 400 12 gauge targets shot March through September. The state was divided into two zones and champions named in each. Mickey Freeman won the northern zone race with a 391 aggregate and Paul Collins led the southern zone with 392. Additional southern winners were George Murray, Class A; Don Paolini, Class C; Buck Castor, Class D; Ron Lord, Class E; and Lorene Collins, Class E runner-up.

after the regular 12 and 20 gauge matches are finished. All entrants must be female with reasonably long hair. They must be novice shooters who have never won anything in a registered skeet match. Each must be accompanied on the firing line by a sponsor who may also act as coach and cheering section. No sponsor may be related to shooter either by marriage or blood, no matter which is thicker. Shooters

may select their own sponsors or management will gladly designate a sponsor for each contestant. Any gauge may be used. Fees are \$5 with shells; \$3 without.

And a word to the spectators: please refrain from undue demonstrations during the match. Applause or raspberries shall be limited to the periods during rounds where shooters are not on the firing line.
